Kick off to SR 522 Construction

The City of Kenmore is completing several improvements on SR 522 to reduce future congestion, improve transit reliability and increase vehicle and pedestrian safety.

Construction on SR 522 between 73rd Avenue Northeast and 83rd Place Northeast will begin in late May 2007 and will continue through 2008. Improvements will include:

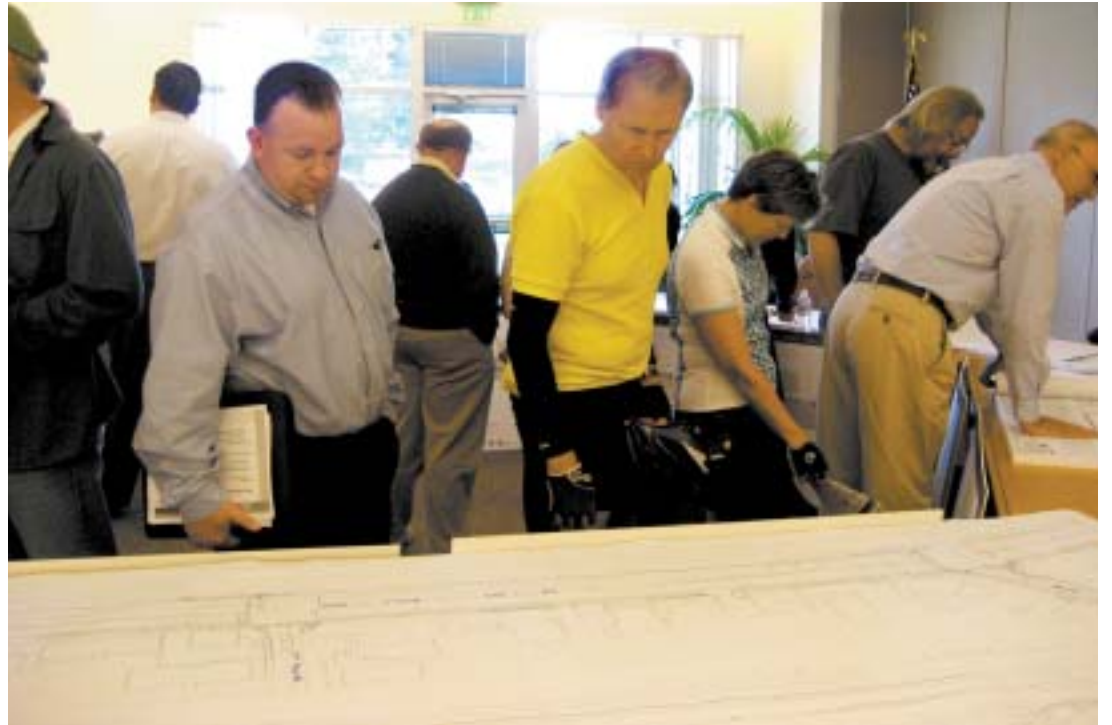
- Extending Business Access and Transit lanes
- Replacing the Swamp Creek Bridge
- New traffic signals at Kenmore Square and 83rd Place Northeast
- Undergrounding utilities
- Widening the 80th Avenue Northeast approach
- New sidewalks, street lighting, landscaping and medians

FIREWORKS BAN

In 2004, Kenmore City Council passed Ordinance Number 04-0204 making the sale, discharge or possession of any fireworks illegal (this includes safe and sane fireworks). The ordinance became effective June 18, 2005. Kenmore,

along with the rest of the region, is growing. As the area becomes more congested and more urban, the risks associated with private fireworks displays must be minimized for the sake of public safety.

To help ensure we all have a safe and considerate Fourth of July, the City will increase police enforcement June 27 – July 4th. Anyone caught possessing or discharging fireworks, of any kind, will be cited by police and the fireworks confiscated. Fireworks offenses are misdemeanors with a maximum penalty of 90 days in jail and/or a \$1,000 fine.
