DEVELOPMENT INVESTMENTS

Strategically, the intent is to grow jobs in industries such as technology, healthcare and natural health sciences to an enhanced downtown core. To support this growth, the city is fulfilling the plan to develop Kenmore Village, an eight-acre multi-use development. City officials foresee a final design that includes an inviting public square or town green, retail, dining and commercial spaces and high-density, multi-family homes.



To prepare for the development and to support the newly built Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Gold Certified Kenmore City Hall, Kenmore Library and the Fire District Headquarters, the city recently invested \$80 million in major streetscape and intersection improvements along SR 522.
